Woodleigh is a mail order nursery that dispatches NZ wide. We like to make it as easy as possible to shop with us, so feel free to phone or email us your order. We have developed a very informative website where you can easily access colour images of our plants. The website is constantly maintained with up-to-date information, including current availability of plants in this catalogue, varieties that we have only in small numbers and others as they come available.

You are welcome to visit our nursery by appointment. We do encourage you to view our catalogue online first as not all varieties will be in flower. Please phone to arrange a visit.

Freight varies according to where you live and the size of your order. As a guide, the minimum freight charge is approx:

**North Island** - \$20.50 for a box that will hold approx 7 x 3 litre pots,

**South Island** \$22 (for up to 4 x 3 litre pots), \$35.00 (for 5 - 7), \$52.00 (for 8 - 9).

**Rural Delivery** - an additional \$9 / box. (**Note:** This does add an extra 2-3 days to delivery; Courier Post will not accept liability for any damage that occurs)

An invoice will be emailed once the order is confirmed with our bank account for payment.

If you wish to have substitutes for any items sold out, please say so otherwise we will not substitute. All plants are believed to be correctly named and true to description.

Almost all of our plants are grown in pots and can be sent at any time of year. The Hydrangeas and other plants are mostly grown in PB5 plastic bag pots which have approx 3 litres volume. The natives are in PB3 unless otherwise stated.

<b>Adria</b>	A great dwarf mophead with stunning sea blue flowers. 1.5m	20
<b>Agnes Pavelli</b>	Tall mophead Hydrangea with large heads of pure white flowers. Fine foil for woodland shrubs. It will tolerate morning sun as long as the soil is not too dry, flowers will burn when exposed to hot midday sun. 2m	20
<b>Alpenglow</b>	Rich glowing red mophead flowers; or lovely purple tone in acid soil. A great cut-flower variety with nicely shaped rounded heads. A robust, easy-care variety. 1.5m	20
<b>Altona</b>	A superb blue mophead in acid soils. Good coastal plant and dried cut flower. 1.5m	20
<b>Amethyst</b>	A compact plant with rounded ruffled blooms either pale violet-blue or soft pink depending on the acidity of the soil. A perfect plant for small gardens or under windows. 1m	20
<b>Arthur Billard **</b>	Lovely rich glowing red mophead. How this has been ignored for decades is a mystery. 1.2m	20
<b>Ayesha</b>	Large heads of pale pink or light blue flowers. The petals are thick and fleshy, quite different from any other Hydrangea. Wind hardy. 2m.	20
<b>Beaute Vendomoise</b>	Huge dinner plate size floating lacecaps flowers in the palest butterfly blue. A charmer. This is an old variety from the early 1900's. Don't be put off by the name.	20
<b>Birgit Blue</b>	A compact, bushy hydrangea, with abundant pink or blue flowers. The flowers open pale and deepen with age. 1m	20
<b>Bloody Marvellous</b> (Merveille Sanguine)	UNIQUE plant with red leaves and superb red wine mophead flowers. In Europe this is called Merveille Sanguine which translates as Marvellous Blood. Also known as Raspberry Crush and Raspberry Fantasy. Does prefer light shade to prevent petal burn. 1.5m	20
<b>Blue Diamond</b>	Lovely cool blue mophead flowers on a compact plant. Grows well in shade. 1.2m	20
<b>Blue Meisse</b>	Super-duper vibrant blue lacecap. Plant them on a slope so you can look down on them 1.6m	20
<b>Bridal Bouquet</b>	Appropriate name for this beautiful white mophead. Grow in shade and you'll have the added joy of green antique flowers in autumn time. 1.3m	20
<b>Colonel Durham **</b>	Smokey blue mopheads in acid soils or salmon pink in alkaline soils. Looks fabulous in a shady spot under trees. Very free flowering and popular for cut flower. Lovely autumn tones - flowers antique red-wine tones. 1.5m	20
<b>Coral</b>	A stunning multi-coloured variety. The flowers open predominantly pink or blue and as the season progresses the colour palette changes to combinations of pink, purple, blue and green. A tidy compact plant. 1.2m	20
<b>Domotoi</b>	A delightful mophead with double frilled flowers, either pale blue or soft pink. 1m	20
<b>Elbe**</b>	Elbe has large pale blue mophead flowers in acid soils or pale pink if planted in a pot or in lime soil. Great smaller growing variety. 1.2m	20
<b>Emerald</b>	A smaller growing white hydrangea. Flowers open creamy white, before turning a lovely emerald green. Does require protection from midday summer sun to preserve the flowers. 1m	20
<b>Emotion (YouMe)   AVAILABLE SUMMER</b>	Large flower heads of double, star shaped florets in a lace-cap form. Soft to mid pink or blue if planted in soil. Compact plant. 1.2m	20
<b>Eternity (YouMe)</b>	A delightful double pink with a cream centre or blue mophead depending on soil type. Large double lacecap flowers last very well. Plant this one in a pot to keep the gorgeous pink flowers. 1.3m	20
<b>Etincelent (Glittering)</b>	An oldie but goodie from the mid 1900's. We have recently propagated this one from the Pukekura Park hydrangea collection. Tidy compact form, with firm, mid blue mophead flowers. 1.2m	20
<b>Fireworks (Hanabi)</b>	A lovely white double lacecap, both sterile and true flowers are double giving a frilly lace effect. Performs better in shade. A big tall wind hardy shrub, salt tolerant. 2m ( <b>Note we have previously listed this as Fuji Waterfall, however we have recently discovered this is not the correct name for this plant.</b> )	20
<b>Forever (YouMe)</b>	Lovely double lacecap flowers in colours of either delicate pale pink or blue (depending on soil). Grows well in a pot. 1.3m.	20
<b>Frau Yoshimi</b>	Lady Yoshimi is an eye-catching bi-coloured mophead; purple or red depending on soil, with a white frilled edge. Tidy compact plant. 1.2m	20
<b>Frillibet   SOLD OUT - see Amethyst or Hopaline</b>	As the name suggests the flower heads on this plant are frilly. The soft powder blue or pale pink sepals have frilly edges and are absolutely gorgeous. The sepals are cream as they open gradually changing to their true colour,	20

	giving a two toned effect. Does require partial shade to prevent flowers burning. Can take a few years to establish as it is not a strong plant.	
<b>Gartenbau Kunhert</b>	Superb sky blue mophead. Has a second strong flowering in Autumn when most are finishing. 1.5m	20
<b>Gentian (Enziandom)</b>	One of the best. Huge rich blue mopheads. Needs acid soils. Great cut flower. 1.8m	20
<b>Geoffrey Chadbund</b>	An outstanding spirea-red lacecap. Always admired. Very similar to Fasan	20
<b>Goldie</b>	The stand out feature of this hydrangea is its 'Goldie', lime green coloured foliage, combined with white mophead flowers. Prefers a semi-shaded situation. 1m	20
<b>Grandad</b>	A large growing white variety with large dinner plate sized mophead flowers. Requires protection from mid-day sun. 1.8m	20
<b>Green Shadow   AVAILABLE JANUARY</b>	The flowers open with a definite dark green tinge, before turning a true red, then again taking on a green hue as the flowers antique. Popular for cut-flower, grows well in a pot. 1.5m	20
<b>Green Veil</b>	Another smaller growing white variety with a frilled edge. Flowers open limey green before turning white. They will antique green in lower light conditions. 1m	20
<b>Hamburg</b>	A strong growing plant with enormous mophead flowers, either a lovely pink or blue, with massive foliage. Great for drying. 1.5m	20
<b>Harry's Red</b>	Harry's Red has fabulous round crimson heads. Add lime to get the best red tones. Lovely rich autumn colours, great for cut flower. A compact plant, perfect for small gardens. 1.3m.	20
<b>Heinrich Seidel</b>	Good-sized mopheads with frilly edged sepals. A lovely lilac shade in acid soil, light red in lime soil. Antiques well with lovely autumn tones. 1.8m	20
<b>Hobella</b>	A gorgeous double lacecap with shell pink sepals which turn green and then red in the antique phase. 1.5m	20
<b>Holstein (see Col. Durham)</b>	Smokey blue mopheads in acid soils or salmon pink in alkaline soils. Looks fabulous in a shady spot under trees. Very free flowering and popular for cut flower. Lovely autumn tones - flowers antique red-wine tones. 1.5m	20
<b>Hopaline</b>	Gorgeous frilled, soft blue mopheads changing to greens and reds in autumn as the flowers antique. Tidy, compact plant. Needs protection from hot midday sun. 1.2m	20
<b>Hornli</b>	A true dwarf with pinky-red mophead flowers. Great for a pot or planted as a low hedge. 0.6m	20
<b>Immaculata</b>	One of the best white hydrangeas. The ice white mops turn red or green in late summer. Smaller growing. 1.2m	20
<b>Libelle</b>	A lovely lacecap. White sepals contrasting with the true blue flowers in the centre. 1.5m	20
<b>Lightfire</b>	Huge dark glowing red mophead flowers. A vigorous, upright bush with lustrous dark green foliage. Good cut flowers. 1.5m	20
<b>Lilacina</b>	A delightful lacecap, sepals either pink or blue depending on the soil, contrasting with violet blue true flowers. A tough hardy plant. 1.8m	20
<b>Lollipop</b>	This is a gorgeous small growing variety. Small, tightly packed, mophead flowers in either soft pink or blue. As the flowers mature they become 2-toned with a touch green before antiquing red and green. 1m	20
<b>Madame Baardse   SOLD OUT</b>	Madame Baardse is a vibrant red in alkaline soils, in acid soils a lovely soft violet. It is a very compact plant with lovely, shiny, dense foliage; perfect for pots and tubs, in a small courtyard or in the front of a border. 1m	20
<b>Madame Cayeux**</b>	A lovely old fashioned mophead, one of the 'Grandma' series of hydrangeas. Madam Cayeux has large strong rosy pink flowers, which change colour in autumn to metallic antique shades. 1.5m	20
<b>Madame Emile Mouillere</b>	A lovely white mophead, with glossy leaves making it more tolerant of coastal conditions. The flowers are long lasting if given protection from intense midday sun, aging light pink or antique green in shade. This is a vigorous plant with an informal, arching habit. It is more cold hardy than many varieties, coastal hardy.	20
<b>Madame Plumecoq   AVAILABLE AUTUMN</b>	A delicious truly soft pink mophead with distinctive lush foliage. 1.5m	20
<b>Madame Truffaut</b>	The beautiful soft powder-blue mophead flowers are frilly and almost double. Requires shade. Weaker constitution when young. 1.5m	20
<b>Magical Robin</b>	One of the newer imports to NZ. A very good dark pink flower, fading to green. Great cut flower. Smaller growing bush. 1.2m	20
<b>Mars   SOLD OUT - see Saturn</b>	One of the City-line series. A small, compact growing variety, with bicolor flowers - purple red with a white margin. 1m	20

<b>Masja</b>	One of the best reds for tub culture. Small compact plant with glowing red flowers. 1.2m	20
<b>Mathilda Gutges</b>	Dwarf plant with intense blue mophead flowers. Good for a smaller garden 1.2m	20
<b>Merritts Supreme</b>	Rich maroon-purple flowers with a frilled edge and glossy green foliage. Tolerates wind and coastal conditions. Compact. 1.3m	20
<b>Miss Belgium</b>	An oldie but a goodie (breed 1935). Masses of purplish-blue (acid soils) or magenta-red mophead flowers smother this bush. 1.5m	20
<b>Montgomery</b>	A lovely plant with interesting colours regardless of soil pH. Vary from ruby red through to magenta purple with a blue centre. 1.2m.	20
<b>Mrs Alice Blandy **   AVAILABLE JANUARY</b>	A lovely old variety from Granny's day. Pale blue mophead. Prefers midday shade to avoid petal burn.1.5m	20
<b>Mrs Kumiko</b>	Rich lilac-pink mophead with very firm flower, frilled. Great for cut flowers. Stays a good pink in acid soil. 1.5m	20
<b>Nightingale</b>	Big bold rich blue lacecaps. The "best" of the large blue lacecaps. 1.8m	20
<b>Nigra</b>	Very striking black stems contrast with the small blue mopheads. Flowers will be a nice delicate pink in lime soils. 1.2m	20
<b>Nikko Blue</b>	A lovely soft blue mophead, with flowers smothering the plant. Has thinner stems, lending it a more delicate appearance. Does require some shade. A lovely compact hydrangea for the smaller garden. 1.2m	20
<b>Nizza</b>	Lovely blue lacecap flowers or pink if grown in a pot. A smaller growing, compact plant. Good cut flower.1.2m	20
<b>Opal</b>	This is a favourite. Large firm, mophead flowers, either a rosy pink or violet blue depending on the soil. Lovely antique tones. Great cut flower. Forms a compact shrub. 1.2m	20
<b>Opuloides</b>	Neat white and blue lacecaps flowers on a modest size bush. 1.3m Scented flowers	20
<b>Otaksa</b>	An old old Japanese variety with glossy wind hardy leaves. Big plant with huge pale blue mophead flowers. Good for drying. Coastal and wind tolerant. Petals can burn in full sun. 2.5m	20
<b>Paris</b>	City-line series. A stunning red mophead, maintaining its colour well in acid soils. Compact. 1m	20
<b>Parzival</b>	Rosy pink, rich magenta to light sea-blue.Quite stunning with different colour toned heads at one time.1.5m	20
<b>Passion</b>	One of the 'You Me' series. A tidy compact hydrangea with large heads of double pink or blue flowers. Each individual flower looks like a miniature rose. 1m	20
<b>Peppermint   AVAILABLE JANUARY</b>	A lovely bi-colour variety. The mophead flowers are white with a brush stroke of either blue or pink depending on the pH of the soil. Protect from afternoon sun to prevent petal burn.	20
<b>Piamina   SOLD OUT</b>	A miniature hydrangea with small pink to lavender mophead flowers. Can take a while to establish. 0.6m	20
<b>President Doumer   SOLD OUT</b>	Ruby red intensifies to maroon in these small mophead flowers.Small bush 1.3m	20
<b>President Touchard</b>	An excellent variety with masses of smallish pink or rich lilac blue heads. One of the best purples. 1.5m	20
<b>Princess Beatrix   SOLD OUT</b>	Masses of huge, frilly pink mophead blooms; purple in acid soils. 1.5m	20
<b>Princess Juliana</b>	Lovely pure white mop head flowers. Antiques pink or green. Great cut flower.It will tolerate morning sun as long as the soil is not too dry, flowers will burn when exposed to hot midday sun. 1.5m	20
<b>Quadricolor</b>	Variegated leaves with four distinct colours in shades of green, cream and yellow. Pale pink to light blue lacecap flowers. Shade. 1.5m	20
<b>Red Emperor</b>	One of the best reds and tends to stay red in acid soil.1.3m	20
<b>Red Start</b>	Unique rich dark red lacecap with spiralled flowers. 1.5m	20
<b>Red Glow (Rheinland)   AVAILABLE JANUARY</b>	Glowing red mopheads, one of the best. Lovely purple in acid soil. Ideal for cut flower. Smaller grower. 1.2m	20
<b>Renate Steiniger</b>	Stunning rich blue flower heads turn metallic blue/green/crimson in autumn. 1.5m	20
<b>Rochambeau **   SOLD OUT</b>	A lovely old fashioned rosy pink or purple blue mophead. 1.2m	20
<b>Romance (You Me)</b>	A lacecap type, smothered with multitudes of double star shaped pink or blue flowers. Great in a pot. 1m	20

<b>Sabrina</b>	One of the Dutch Lady series with reddish coloured leaves. A lovely red and white twin coloured mop. Best in shade. 1.5m	20
<b>Saturn</b>	Large 2 toned deep pink (or purple/blue if in acid soil) and white mophead flowers. Prefers light shade to prevent burning. Flowers will antique an aubergine tone as they age in autumn. Compact form, 1m.	20
<b>Seafoam</b>	Thought to be the wild form of <i>H. macrophylla</i> . Bold lacecap flowers, coastal hardy. 2m.	20
<b>Selina</b>	Another member of the Dutch Lady Series. A lacecap form with either violet-red or violet-blue coloured flowers depending on the soil. A compact growing plant with bronze coloured foliage. 1.2m	20
<b>Selma</b>	One of the Dutch Lady Series. The mophead flowers are a deep hot pink with a magenta eye, or reddish, violet purple in acid soils. The new foliage has a reddish tone. Good for cut-flower and drying. 1.2m	20
<b>Sensation (Harlequin)</b>	A two toned mophead, each red sepal has a frilly white edge. Tender. 1.2m	20
<b>Shakira</b>	Dutch Lady series. A compact, upright growing form with lovely white mophead flowers. Prefers light shade to prevent petal burn. Will antique green tones in lower light situations. A good smaller growing white variety. 1m	20
<b>Sharona</b>	From the Dutch Lady Series. Pink or blue mophead flowers depending on soil ph. A compact variety with bronze coloured foliage. 1.2m	20
<b>Sparkling Sapphire</b>	Unique shiny green leaves with sky blue flowers. Best protected from the hot sun. 1m	20
<b>Together (You Me)</b>	One of the 'You Me' series. Delicate pale pink or blue lacecap tightly packed with star shaped double blooms. Good pot specimen. 1m.	20
<b>Tosca</b>	Semi-double mophead flowers with a serrated edge, shaded from lovely soft pink to soft blue. A strong growing plant, plant in semi-shade to avoid petal burn. 1.5m	20
<b>Tricolor</b>	A variegated hydrangea with deep green, grayish-green and pale yellow foliage. The lacecap flowers are white with a tinge of pink in the sterile bracts. Prefers some shade, and protection from slugs and snails. 1.8m	20
<b>Trophy</b>	Show stopping double white lacecap. 2m	20
<b>Venice</b>	City-line series. A rich blue in acid soils or a hot pink aging to green in autumn. Stout upright stems on compact plants. Good for cut flowers and drying. 1m.	20
<b>Vibraye (Generale Vicomtesse de Vibraye)*</b>	The best pale blue mophead hydrangea. Flowers turn green in autumn. 1.5m	20
<b>Zaunkonig</b>	Deep pink or purple lacecap flowers are quite lovely. The name means Wren, a small European bird. 1.2m	20
<b>Zurich</b>	City-line series. Stunning dark blue, mophead flowers contrast well with the lush dark green leaves. Compact easy care bush. 1m	20

## H. arborescens

Cold / dry hardy species from eastern USA.

<b>Annabelle</b> (Snowball hydrangea)	An outstanding shrub with very large white flower heads which turn green in late summer. Very cold hardy, requires semi-shade and shelter. 1.5m	22.50
<b>Radiata</b>	A lovely white lacecap, repeat flowering. The underside of the leaf is white, otherwise it has similar foliage and habit to Annabelle. 1.5m	26

## H. aspera

A large growing, hairy-leaved species – Himalaya, China & Taiwan.

<b>Dawn</b>	A compact shrub with lovely white and sapphire blue lacecap flowers. Grow in sun or light shade.	26
<b>Monkey Bridge</b>	A wonderful tree hydrangea with massive lavender, pink & white lacecap flower heads +/- 45cm across. It is an evergreen hydrangea with large, reddish, hairy leaves. Requires a sheltered situation with plenty of room as it is tender, brittle and very large.	26
<b>New Beginnings</b>	An exciting new aspera type hydrangea. Large white and lilac lacecap flowers through the summer. Forms an attractive shrub with large chocolate brown leaves, turning green through the season. Attractive to bees. 2m	26

<b>Pink Lace   AVAILABLE AUTUMN</b>	A compact shrub with soft pink lacecap flowers. Grow in full sun or light shade. 1.5m	26
<b>Villosa   AVAILABLE DECEMBER</b>	Beautiful lilac-blue lacecap flowers through late summer. A very attractive, large growing shrub with narrow hairy leaves. Grow in full sun or light shade. 3m	22.50

## H. paniculata

Cold hardy, sun loving species from Japan and SE China.

<b>Bombshell   AVAILABLE JANUARY</b>	I liken this one to a dwarf Limelight. A profusion of white cone-shape flowers on a very tidy, compact plant. Great mass planted or in a pot. 1.2m	20
<b>Kyushu</b>	A paniculata form with lacey white, cone-shape flowers. Best in sunny situation. 1.5m	20
<b>Limelight</b>	Large lime-green / cream cone-shaped flowers which age pink. A strong upright growing shrub.	20
<b>Sundae Fraise</b>	A lovely new addition to our range. A compact growing hydrangea with mid-sized white flower panicles flushed pink, turning a deeper reddish-pink in late summer. 1.5m	20

## H. quercifolia

Oak Leaved hydrangea species from the woodlands of eastern USA.

<b>Pee Wee</b>	Oak shaped leaves with rich autumn colours. A tidy miniature form with smaller sized flowers too. 1m	22.50
<b>Snowflake</b>	A superb double-flowered form of the oak-leaved hydrangea. The flowers open white, age to rosy pink, and dry well for a winter display. Autumn coloured foliage of wine-red to maroon, bright reds and orange. 1.5m	22.50
<b>Snow Queen   AVAILABLE LATE SUMMER</b>	A lovely single-flowered form, the perfect cones of white flowers turn delightful pink with age. The bold oak-shaped leaves turn rich crimson and purple providing a stunning autumn display. Will handle full sun, though prefers semi-shade in hot climates. 1.5m	26

## H. serrata

Species from the mountains of Japan and Korea. Prefers light shade.

<b>Blue Deckle</b>	Delicious dainty blue lacecaps on a small compact bush. The frilly powder blue sterile florets surround the pale blue true flowers. Ideal for pots & tubs 1m	20
<b>Diadem</b>	A serrata type with delicate pale pink or blue lacecap flowers. 1m	20
<b>Glyn Church</b>	One of my favourite white hydrangeas. The tidy mophead flowers open cream, become pure white gradually taking on a pink tinge then red then red wine or green depending on light levels. This variety usually produces a second flush of blooms in late summer. Best in light shade. 1.5m	20
<b>Grayswood</b>	Terrific plant because it's so unusual. The white lacecaps gradually turn pink then bright red and finally to red wine. All this in one flower. 1.5m	20
<b>Kiyosumi</b>	A delicate lacecap. White flowers with a red picotee edge. Leaves are small with a red tinge. 1.5m	22.50
<b>Miranda   SOLD OUT</b>	This is a lovely little Hydrangea, a true dwarf ideal for the front of the border or in a tub / pot. The bush grows wider than it does high, forming a low mound which is covered with sky-blue lacecap flowers. 0.6m	22.50
<b>Miyama-yae-Murasaki</b>	A lacey looking dark-blue double lacecap with soft green leaves. 1.2m	22.50
<b>Maiko</b>	A low growing; free flowering variety from the mountains of Korea. Lacecaps are light pink or purple. 0.8m	25
<b>Oamacha   SOLD OUT</b>	The tea hydrangea. The sweet leaves are used as an infusion in Buddhist temples. It forms a medium sized bush with purplish lacecap flowers. Lovely autumn colour with the leaves turn dark red.	20
<b>Preziosa</b>	A fabulous hydrangea. Flowers change from pale green, cream to white before turning pink then red wine coloured. 1.5m	20

<b>Shirotae</b>	A beautiful little knee high bush covered in double white starry lacecap flowers turning pink in the late summer. Ideal for pots and tubs or happy in shade. 0.6m	22.50
<b>Tiara</b>	A delightful small shrub smothered with delicate lacecaps in spring, either pale pink or blue. Autumn tones. Requires a shady spot. 1m	20
<b>Wryneck</b>	This is a collectors plant. Slow growing, it forms a small, tidy plant with large soft green leaves. It has small round, soft blue flower heads that are tightly packed with flowers.	22.50

<b>H. angustipetala Gold Dust</b>	A species hydrangea from Taiwan. This one is unusual, having golden yellow true flowers surrounded by creamy white bracts in a lacecap form. An evergreen hydrangea that will grow in full sun or shade. Height 1.5m	22.50
<b>Hydrangea heteromalla 'Bretschneideri'</b>	China. Forms a huge shrub or small tree with a brown trunk and peeling bark. Attractive, white, lacecap flowers early in the season, turning reddish as they age. Hardy.	26
<b>H. indochinensis   AVAILABLE JANUARY</b>	Vietnam. White sterile lacecap flowers contrasting with intense blue true flowers. Shiny blackish-green leaves.	32

## Grandma's Hydrangeas

We have a range of charming old Grandma Hydrangeas. Actually they are a series of forgotten varieties that were nearly lost to cultivation. Most of these have disappeared in Europe; and in NZ haven't been available for decades. We are indebted to the late Os Blumhardt for keeping these plants when everyone else had forgotten them. The varieties with an \*\* are ones from Grandma's day.

### Colours

The macrophylla or large leaf Hydrangeas are fabulous shrubs for providing colour all summer and into autumn. Many have heads which change colour in the autumn and these are called antique colours. Many are ideal cut flowers. Hydrangea colours are nearly all changeable depending on your soil. Alkaline or limey soil gives pinks and reds while acid soils make for good blues. It may take a year or two for blues to show their true colours.

Note: When you purchase your blue hydrangea it will often be pink / purple for the first year or two as they are grown in potting mix which has insufficient aluminium to produce full blue colour.

Hydrangeas like plenty of moisture and most will perform well in sun or shade. A mulch of bark or woodchip will aid their establishment and ongoing health.

The smaller growing varieties make excellent tub and patio plants. It is much easier to grow reds and whites in pots than it is to grow good blues as most potting mixes do not contain free aluminium which is essential for blues.
